NOTES:

- ❖ Everyone must **report on time** for each exam and **homeroom for attendance every day**.
- ❖ Students who are **late to school** will **not be permitted to enter an exam** after it has already begun.
- ❖ Students must stay in the exam testing room until the scheduled testing time is complete.
- ❖ If needed, there will be a **scheduled make-up exam** on **Monday, January 30**, with a proctor in the LGI. If students know in advance that they will miss an exam, they should attempt to organize this with their respective teachers beforehand.
- ❖ Students who have a lunch/study hall exam period are permitted to leave during that designated period **ONLY** if they have written permission from a parent. This permission must be sent to the Attendance office **in advance**. We strongly suggest students use their study hall/lunch exam period to study for additional exams.
- ❖ **Bagged Lunches** will be available during exam week. Students can purchase their lunch during their regularly scheduled lunch period or at the end of the day.

- "Kind words and actions can seem so small, but their effects are truly endless." (Author Unknown)

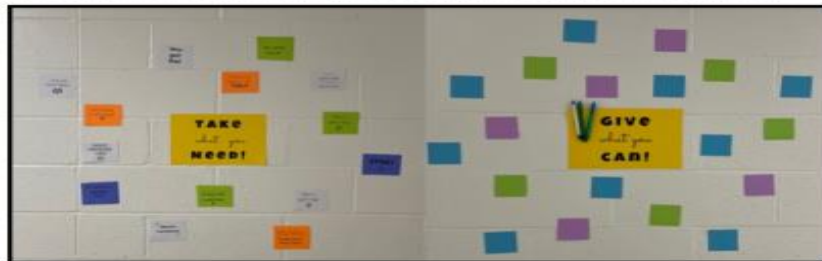
West Deptford High School will celebrate **January** by showing **kindness** in different ways around the building. Below are some ways students can get involved by participating in various activities throughout the month.

Earn College Credits for Eligible High School Classes



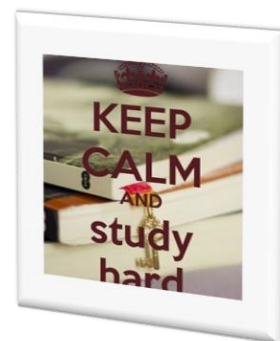

Study Skills

"More important than studying hard is to have a good strategy"

Start with Good Habits

Your **STUDY AREA** should be well lit, organised & quiet

Make **TO DO LISTS** at the beginning of each study session & cross off as you go

Become familiar with **PAST EXAM PAPERS**, so you know what layout to expect

Make sure you get enough **sleep** the night before your exams

Switch off the phone

Use **Speech Cards** or **Sticky Notes** to help remember important points

Have a **good breakfast / lunch** to help your concentration

Take regular **breaks** at least every 50 minutes & get up & move about

Ask your teachers lots of **questions**
Get involved in your lessons

Take regular **breaks** at least every 50 minutes & get up & move about

Make a **Study Timetable** - study the hardest subject when you are feeling most alert

Divide out your **time** carefully in exams to answer all questions

Do not just re-read, **take notes, draw diagrams, test yourself**

Read the **questions** very carefully

Always use all of the **time** given for the exam. **Never leave an exam early!**

Keep up to date & complete all subject homework!!

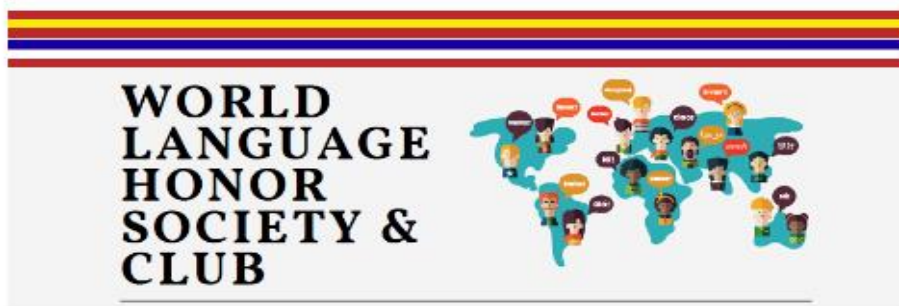


NATIONAL LIBRARY SHELFIE DAY
