





DID YOU KNOW? Students can take COLLEGE COURSE WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL!


Students aged 15 and up who have successfully completed the ninth grade can take college courses through Rowan College South Jersey's HSOP Program (High School Options Program) at a substantial discount.

DIN YOU MYOY These courses are held at the college or may be available online. 10th graders can take courses during the fall semester, spring semester, or any of the three summer terms. Interested families can go to www.rcsj.edu/designyourfuture for more info. Parents are responsible for all associated costs.


Credits from these courses will be reflected on a college transcript that can be submitted for transferability evaluation to the college or university of your choice. WDHS students have had great success in transferring these credits to both in-state and out-of-state schools, as well as public and private schools.

WDHS juniors and seniors can also participate, and WDHS will cover the tuition and fees for up to two courses per semester (Fall and spring).
