- Students in danger of failing a class are encouraged to make up for missing assignments and discuss an improvement plan with their teacher. Students should also develop a study plan for final exams, which count for 10% of their total course grade.

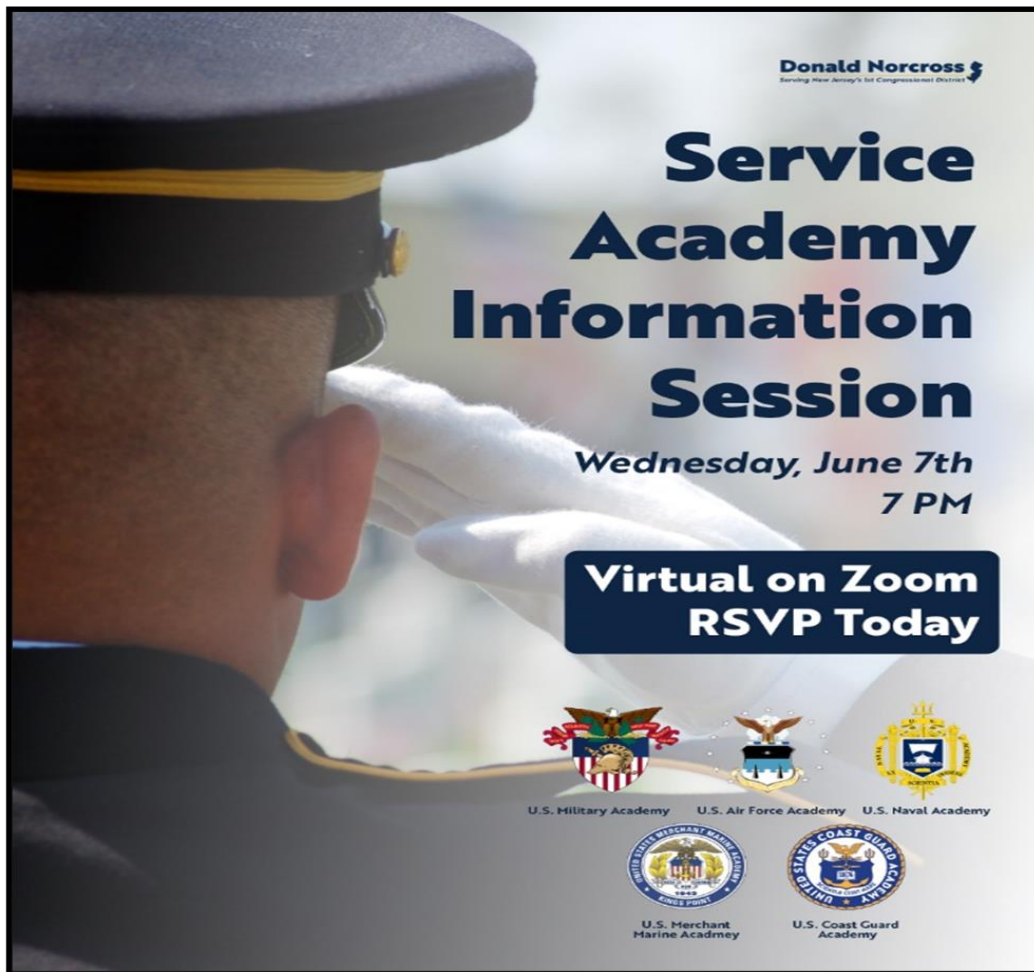
## **SUMMER SCHOOL Credit Recovery Option:**

Students could witness 3 live civil cases in the courtroom and absorb the bench-trial process.

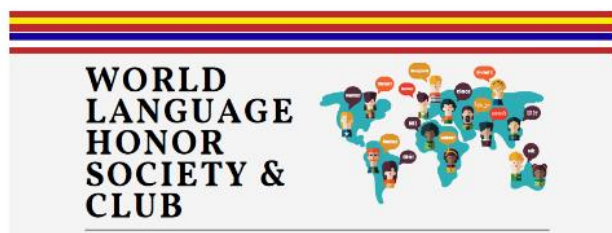


## NEWS FROM THE MARKETING EDUCATION CLASS
