NOTES:

- ❖ Everyone must report on time for each exam and also to homeroom for attendance every day.
- ❖ Students who are late to school will not be permitted to enter an exam after it has already begun.
- ❖ Students are required to stay in the exam testing room until the scheduled testing time is complete.
- ❖ There will be a make-up exam day – FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY - scheduled on the calendar for Friday, June 16th with a proctor in LGI if it is needed. Students should make every attempt to complete exams ahead of time if they know they are going to be out this last week of school.
- ❖ Students that have a lunch/study hall exam period are permitted to leave during that designated period ONLY if they have written permission from a parent. This permission must be sent to the Attendance office in advance. We strongly suggest that students use their study hall/lunch exam period to study for additional exams. All students must sign in and remain in the homeroom each day.

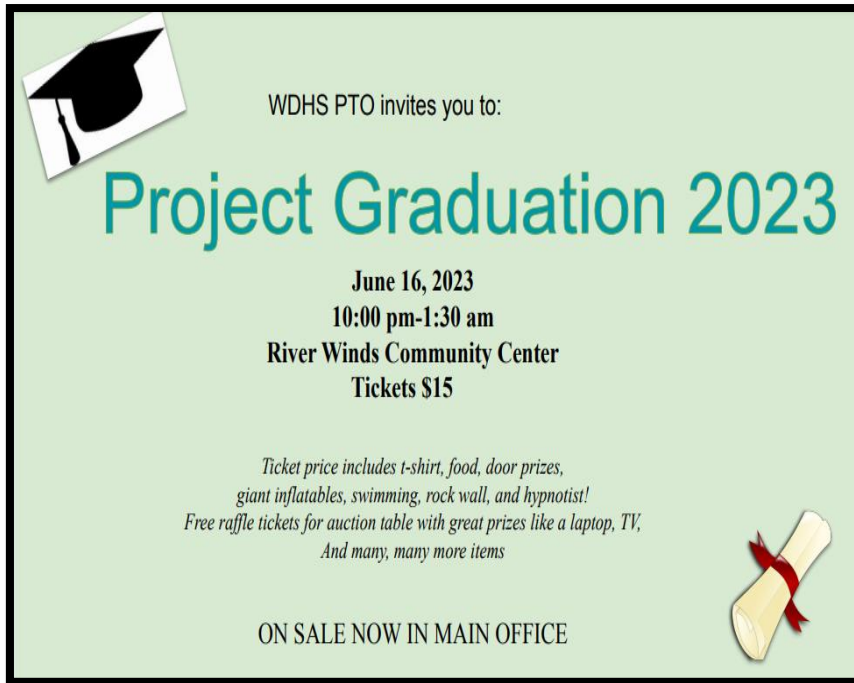
Dear Seniors and Families,

GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT NEWS & NOTES

FINAL EXAMS are NEXT WEEK!

Final exams count for 10% of the overall average in a full year course. Students are encouraged to study diligently for each of their exams.

STUDY TIPS

1. **Make Flash Cards.** Rewrite important facts, concepts, and definitions on flashcards. The physical act of rewriting helps you remember the material. You can then use the flash cards to quiz yourself without the help of others. Digital flashcards and study apps are another way to organize and review the material.
2. **Visualize the Material.** Focus on the most important parts of your class notes by condensing the material and underlining or highlighting key words and concepts. Reformat them into charts, diagrams, or outlines to create visuals that can help you make sense of complex concepts.



3. **Focus on Understanding.** Memorizing means finding ways to remember and repeat facts. Understanding goes a little deeper and means you can apply new knowledge to various scenarios and know how it relates to other concepts.
4. **Stay Focused by Minimizing Distractions.** Keeping your mind on track can be as simple as taking a break from your phone and friends. Put on some instrumental music or noise-canceling headphones, and put your phone on Do Not Disturb to help you focus on your studies.
5. **Take Breaks.** Give your brain and body a chance to refresh to approach the material with energy and attention. For every 30 minutes you study, take a 5-10 minute break to recharge. Stand up, stretch your legs, grab a snack, and get some fresh air before getting back to the books.

POSSIBLE COURSE FAILURES

- Students in danger of failing a class are encouraged to communicate with their teachers, turn in any missing assignments, and develop a study plan for final exams, as these count as 10% of their total course grade.
- Course failures can result in retention, ineligibility for sports and activities, and prolonged time in high school. If you fail a course, be sure to discuss your situation with your school counselor.



SUMMER SCHOOL Credit Recovery Option:

GCIT (Gloucester County Institute of Technology, Sewell) will be hosting a summer school program this year.

- Students **MUST** earn a minimum final grade of 50 in their WDHS class to participate.
- Students may take up to 2 courses only.
- Students **must attend in person at least two days per week**. The rest of the work may be completed online.
- **Registration opens on June 12.**
- Registration **MUST** be completed online at www.gcit.org/summerschool.
