ATTENTION ALL JUNIORS

New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA)

On March 11th - 14th, ALL 11th graders will take the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA). This standardized test is given by the State of New Jersey, required for graduation. Students cannot opt out of this graduation test; if they do not take it, they may be ineligible for a high school diploma. Students will be measured in the English Language Arts and Mathematics standards over these four days. Students will receive more information pertaining to the test within their classrooms over the coming weeks.

1. The community college placement exam, the Accuplacer, will be given at WDHS on March 12 at 7:15 am. If a student misses the test, they will need to go to the RCSJ campus and take it on their own time before registering for college courses for next year.




