## **NOTES:**

- All students must report on time for each exam and be present in homeroom for attendance every day.
- Before each exam, students will have a 30 minute review period and 90 minutes to complete their exam.
- Students who are late to school will not be permitted to enter exam after it has begun.
- Students are required to stay in the testing room until the scheduled testing time is complete.
- There will be a scheduled make-up exam day on Thursday, June 16, 2016 or Friday, June 17, 2016 with a proctor in LGI/Media Center. Students who are not making up an exam on June 16, 2016 will follow the standard period 1-4 half-day bell schedule. Students who are not making up an exam on Friday, June 17, 2016 will follow the standard period 5-8 half-day bell schedule.
- Students who have a lunch/study hall exam period are permitted to leave after their 1st exam and homeroom ONLY if they have written permission from parents sent to Attendance Office. We strongly suggest that students use their study hall/lunch exam period to study for additional exams.

I understand that the name St. Baldrick's, the logo, and the leprechaun icon are registered trademarks of the St. Baldrick's Foundation ("SBF"). I agree that the use of such registered trademarks in any printed materials or advertising requires the prior written approval of SBF. I also agree that I will not allow or participate in the use of a razor to shave the head of anyone at the activity benefitting SBF (if head-shaving is taking place), and that I will review and abide by SBF procedures regarding the proper handling of financial donations and assist SBF in clarifying and recognizing any and all donations collected by me as a representative of and volunteer for SBF, as described on SBF's website.

## **PUBLICITY CONSENT & RELEASE**

I hereby irrevocably grant SBF permission to use my name, biographical and occupational description, and business and personal information as provided by me to SBF. ## Requirements for Donating Hair

- Hair should be at least 8 inches in length or longer is preferred.
- Hair must be clean and dry, pony-tailed and/or braided (this keeps the hair in one direction).

- Non-chemically treated hair is preferred (but any hair in good condition will be accepted).
- Gray hair is accepted.
